




- Provide authentic learning experiences, working alongside professionals in varied fields

- Cost per pupil for each convocation determined by activity, number of participants, etc.
 - Average costs:
 - 2-day event: \$80
 - 1-day event: \$45
- ▶ 1-2 teachers volunteer to facilitate and arrange convocation
- Busing is included in cost

- 1 teacher for every12 student participants
 - Typically teachers run break-out sessions and are involved in the delivery of the activities
