BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a public hearing be held at the Keansburg Board of Education/Bolger Middle School located at 100 Palmer Place, Keansburg, NJ 07734 on April 26, 2022 at 7pm for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on the budget for the 2022-2023 School Year.

Travel and Related Expense Reimbursement

WHEREAS, the Keansburg School District Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3 et seq. requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Keansburg School District Board of Education established \$50,000 as the maximum travel amount for the current school year and has expended \$478.79 as of this date; now

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THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursement in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3, to a maximum expenditure of \$50,000 for the 2022-2023 school year.
